1.0 Introduction:

1.1 All India Institute of Medical Sciences Mangalagiri (AIIMS Mangalagiri)

The All India Institute of Medical Sciences [AIIMS] Mangalagiri was designed to serve as a nucleus for nurturing excellence in all aspects of health and wellness program throughout India. AIIMS are a group of autonomous public medical institutes that have been declared by an Act of Parliament 1956 as “Institute of National Importance”. AIIMS Mangalagiri is one of the four “Phase IV” AIIMS healthcare institutes being established by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna (PMSSY) on October 2015.

The institute plans to have comprehensive facilities for teaching, research and patient care. As provided in the act, AIIMS conducts teaching programs in medical course at undergraduate levels and awards its own degree.

2.0 AIMS& Objectives

2.1 Objectives AIIMS Mangalagiri

- To develop pattern of teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate medical education in all its branches so as to demonstrate high standard of medical education.
- To bring together in one place educational facilities of the highest order for the training of personnel in all important branches of health activity.
- To attain self-sufficiency in Postgraduate Medical Education.

2.2 Functions of AIIMS Mangalagiri

- Undergraduate and postgraduate teaching in medical and related physical biological sciences.
- Innovations in education.
- For producing medical professionals for the country.
- Research in medical and related sciences.
- Health care: Preventive, promote and cure at primary, secondary and tertiary level.
- Community based teaching and research.

3.0 Duration of course

The duration of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (M.B.B.S.) course of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences Mangalagiri shall last for **four and half year and one year compulsory rotatory internship**.

4.0 Number of seats & reservation

AIIMS Mangalagiri

The total of 125 (**Hundred Twenty Five**) seats for Indian Nationals are available for admission to MBBS course. Out of these, **19 (nineteen)** seats are reserved for the Scheduled Castes, **09 (Nine)** seats are reserved for the Scheduled Tribes, **34 (Thirty four)** seats are reserved for Other Backward Classes, **13 (Thirteen)** seats are reserved for Economically Weaker Section and **50 (fifty)** seats for General Category for Indian Nationals. The policy of reservation of Government of India is applied at AIIMS Mangalagiri (details in the table below). A 5% reservation for Person with Benchmark Disability (PWBD) as per provision of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 shall be provided on horizontal basis, amongst the seats available.

In accordance with the Rights of PWD Act 2016, 5% PWBD Reservation on Horizontal & category basis will be followed subject to submission of certificate of disability provided by NTA (National Testing Agency), NEET 2021 admissions into MBBS course.

4.1 Criteria for other backward classes (Non-creamy layer) [OBC]

Reservation for OBC (Non-Creamy Layer) shall be according to the rules of the Government of India. Applicants are required to ensure that he/she does **not** belong to the persons/sections (Creamy Layer) mentioned in Column 3 of the Schedule to the Government of India,

Department of Personnel & Training O.M. No. 36012/22/93-Estt. (SCT) dated 08/09/93 which is modified vide OM No. 36033/3/2004 Estt. (Res.) dated 09/03/2004 or the latest notification of the Government of India (i.e. Central list). A format is provided at the end of the Prospectus. Certificate to be produced during seat allocation should **NOT** be older than **ONE Year on date of First end of Seat allocation.**

4.2 Criteria for Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe (SC /ST)

Reservation for SC/ST candidates will be according to the rules of Government of India. Applicants will be required to produce the necessary certificate in the format provided. During counseling the certificate as prescribed in M.H.A., O.M., No. 42/21/49-N.G.S. dated the 28.1.1952, as revised in Dept. of Per-& A.R. letter No. 36012/6/76-Est. (S.CT), dated the 29.10.1977, to be produced by candidate belonging to a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe in support of his/her claim.

4.3 Criteria for Persons with Benchmark Disability (PWBD)

In accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, 5% seats of the annual sanctioned intake capacity shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities, based on the merit list of Entrance Examination 2021. For this purpose the Specified Disability contained in the Schedule to the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 is annexed in APPENDIX. The candidate must possess a valid document certifying his/her physical disability. The disability certificate should be certified by a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board of the State or Central Govt. Hospitals/Institutions. All PWBD candidates shall be evaluated by a Medical Board of the Institute to determine eligibility.

4.4 Criteria for Economically Weaker Section (EWS)

Reservation for EWS shall be according to the rules of the Government of India. Applicants will be required to produce the necessary certificate in the format provided at the end of the prospectus in support of his/her claim. Certificate to be produced during seat allocation should **NOT be older than ONE Year** on date of First end of Seat allocation.

5.0 Eligibility: Indian Nationals

However, their candidature will be considered only if they provide documentary evidence of having passed the qualifying Examination with the required subjects and percentage of marks. • If the institute has to consider an examination of an Indian university or of a foreign/university to be equivalent to the 12th class under 10+2 scheme/intermediate science examination, the candidates shall have to produce a certificate from the concerned Indian university/Association of Indian Universities to the effect that the examination passed by him/her is considered to be equivalent to the 12th class under 10+2 scheme/intermediate science examination. • NOTE: The essential Academic qualifications for AIIMS are different from those prescribed by MCC for other medical colleges (Note: page 17 of NEET information Bulletin)

6.0 Anti ragging measures:

6.1 Supreme Court rules regarding anti ragging

As per direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government has banned ragging completely in any form inside and outside the campus and all the AIIMS authorities are determined not to allow any form of ragging. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or instigates ragging within or outside any of the AIIMS shall have an FIR lodged against him/her and he/she will be suspended or rusticated from the institution and shall also be liable to be fined which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission can be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution. The punishment may also include suspension from attending the classes, withholding / withdrawing fellowship / scholarship and other financial benefits or withholding the result.

6.2 Anti Ragging Registration

Selected candidates shall register him/her in website

www.antiragging.in/www.amanmovement.org and take printout and submit the self attested printout to Admission cell within 7 days.

7.0 Admissions to AIIMS Mangalagiri

7.1 General

Admitted candidates must attend the Induction Programme and join classes as & when session begins for AIIMS Mangalagiri. The admission of the candidates, who fail to join the Course by the date stipulated in the letter of intimation, shall automatically be cancelled and such seats shall then be offered to the candidates on the waiting list in order of merit in the same category.

Normally no candidate will be admitted to the MBBS course beyond the date stipulated in the letter of intimation of the year of the admission. The candidates who are admitted beyond the date stipulated in the letter of intimation of the year of the admission will be eligible for appearing in the First Professional Examination only with the next batch of students.

However due to ongoing pandemic, the reporting and joining dates given by MCC, DGHS will be followed.

Candidates selected for admission to the MBBS course at the AIIMS after verification of their eligibility and offered admission should bring the following original certificates/testimonials/documents at the **time of admission**

- I. Certificate of having passed the 10+2 or equivalent Examinations, showing the subject offered by him/her in the Examination
- II. Certificate from the Board from which he/she passed the High School/Higher Secondary Examination, showing his/her date of birth.
- III. Certificate/Mark sheet from the Board from which he/she passed the 10+2 or equivalent Examination showing that he/she has secured 60% or more marks (50% in case of SC/ST/Persons with Benchmark Disability) in aggregate in English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology.
- IV. Migration certificate from the University/Board last attended by him/her.
- V. Applicable only to candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Tribe/OBC/EWS/OPH Category:
 - SC/ST Certificate issued by the competent authority. Community should be clearly mentioned in the certificate.
 - OBC Certificate issued by the competent authority. The sub-caste should tally with the **central list** of OBC. OBC candidates should not belong to Creamy layer. **OBC certificate must be in the prescribed format.**
 - EWS Certificate issued by the competent authority.
 - Certificate from prescribed authority showing that he/she belongs to Persons with Benchmark Disability Category
 - Those who joined MBBS course at AIIMS Mangalagiri his/her original certificates retained and same will not return to the candidate before completion of the course. If a candidate who joined MBBS course, leaves the said course shall be liable to pay sum of 5000/- (Rupees five thousand only) by way of compensation/losses incurred by AIIMS due to such midstream departure.

7.2 Fees & other payments

The dues are to be paid in cash or DD immediately, after you have been declared medically fit in the Medical Board of the Institute as per details given below:

7.3 Eligibility criteria for appearing professional examination

Academic section will prepare or compile the eligible list of candidates for the professional examination based on the essentialities for qualifying to appear in the professional examination as follows

7.4 Attendance

Attendance to MBBS course is compulsory.

Every MBBS student must obtain 75% attendance in theory and minimum 80% attendance in practical in each subject before they are permitted to appear in the professional examination.

Eligibility is given subject wise and the student can appear for the final exam only in those subjects in which he/she is eligible.

7.5 Internal assessment marks

- Weightage for internal assessment shall be 50% of the total marks in each subject.
- A Student must secure 50% marks of the total marks fixed for internal assessment in a particular subject in order to be eligible to appear in a professional examination of that subject. Students who fail to secure 50% marks in 1A are not eligible or detained for the appearing of professional examination.

7.6 Compulsory rotatory internship training

After passing the Final M.B.B.S. Examination, all the candidates will be required to do compulsory internship for a period of one calendar year (12 months) in the hospital and rural health centers recognized by the AIIMS. During the internship period, the interns are allowed a total of 15 days leave in full term of one year. (Any Modification of rules of Internship will be notified separately).

The degree of M.B.B.S. shall be awarded after satisfactory completion of one year's internship.
